'permanent grassland and permanent pasture' (together referred to as 'permanent grassland') shall be land used to grow grasses or other herbaceous forage naturally (self-seeded) or through cultivation (sown) and that has not been included in the crop rotation of the holding for five years or more, as well as, where Member States so decide, that has been neither tilled nor ploughed up for five years or more; it may include other species such as shrubs or trees which can be grazed and, where Member States so decide, other species such as shrubs or trees which produce animal feed, provided that the used to grow grasses or and other herbaceous forage naturally (self-seeded) or through cultivation (sown) remain predominant. It may include other species such as shrubs and/or trees which can be grazed or produce animal feed Member States may also decide to consider as permanent grassland any of the following:

- land which can be grazed and which forms part of established local practices where grasses and other herbaceous forage are traditionally not predominant in grazing areas;

- land which can be grazed where grasses and other herbaceous forage are not predominant or are absent in grazing areas;
